

Emmanouil Chrysos received his Medical Degree from the University of Athens (January 1987). He completed his training in General Surgery at the following hospitals: Venizeleio–Pananeio General Hospital of Heraklion, Crete (May 1989 – January 1990), and the University Hospital of Heraklion, Crete (February 1990 – August 1994).

He obtained his PhD in Medicine from the University of Crete (July 1994). He then pursued further postgraduate training in the United Kingdom (August 1994 – August 1996) in colorectal surgery and in hepatobiliary and pancreatic diseases at the following centers: University Royal Victoria Hospital, University City Hospital, and Mater Hospital, Belfast, U.K., where he served in a salaried, permanent position as a Surgical Registrar.

Emmanouil Chrysos served as Consultant Surgeon (Grade B) in General Surgery at the General Surgery Clinic of the University Hospital of Heraklion (November 1996 – June 2001). He was elected Assistant Professor of Surgery at the School of Medicine, University of Crete, in May 2000. Subsequently, he was elected Associate Professor and then Full Professor of Surgery in 2017. Since September 2018, he has been serving as Director of the University Surgical Clinic of PAGNI (University Hospital of Heraklion).

His research interests include the following fields:

Gastrointestinal Surgery, Gastrointestinal Motility, Laparoscopic Surgery, Gastrointestinal Oncology, and Endocrine Surgery. He has contributed to the authorship of the books

*"Gastrointestinal Motility"* and *"Inflammatory Bowel Diseases"*, as well as 109 publications in international peer-reviewed journals, which have received approximately 3,100 citations and an h-index of 34. He has participated in a large number of national and international conferences as an invited speaker.

Finally, he has organized more than 35 ATLS seminars as Course Director.
